Project-based learning (PBL) is considered to be one of the most effective ways to promote student engagement. In this practical presentation Mari will introduce a global PBL project conducted between her adolescent learners and high school students in Moldova, and will report on the students' and her own reflections on this project with a focus on student engagement. The audience will have ample opportunity to contribute to the session through discussions in relation to their own unique teaching contexts.

Mari Nakamura, the founder of a professional development community, MELEP, has 30 years of experience in teaching young learners. She gave a plenary presentation on her intercultural exchange projects and learner agency at the JALT 2019 International Conference.

Yoko Takano, Tryalogue How to Make a Student-Centered Classroom



According to some theories which explain useful practices for young learners, student-centered classrooms make students more motivated to learn language because the atmosphere lets them express their opinion without feeling anxiety. The presenter will give the workshop to inform attendees how to use materials effectively to set up students-centered lessons. In addition, she explores specific teaching episodes with young learners in her own private school to focus on communicative language teaching (CLT).

Yoko Takano obtained her MA TESOL from Nagoya University of Foreign Studies (NUFS) and works for three private universities: Meijo, Nanzan University and NUFS as a part-time lecturer.
